

**2020 PHILIP C. JESSUP INTERNATIONAL LAW MOOT COURT**

**Schedule:**

- **July 5<sup>th</sup>: Posting and distribution of the case and basic material**
- **August 2<sup>nd</sup>: Deadline for submitting legal briefs**
- **August 10<sup>th</sup>: Oral Pleadings**
- **August 12<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup>: Personal Interviews Period**
- **August 30<sup>th</sup>: Results**

➤ You must submit two written briefs, assuming the representation of both parties to the disputes outlined in the *Compromis*.

➤ Each written brief (excluding title page, contents and authorities) shall be no more than 15 pages long.

➤ Briefs shall be typed on “A-4” size paper with 2.6 cm. margins and 12-point, Times New Roman font. The brief shall be double-spaced.

➤ Competitor names should **not** be in any portion of the submitted brief. In place of names, the title page of the brief should state an **alias or pseudonym**.

➤ The submission deadline is on August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 20:00 h. Points will be deducted for briefs turned in within 24 hours after the due date.

➤ Competitors shall submit two (2) envelopes, containing the following:

○ Envelope 1: Four (4) printed copies of each brief and a CD or pen drive containing the computer file of each brief.

○ Envelope 2: Personal statement written in English and indicating your reasons for participating in the competition; a complete Resume written in English; a list of the courses undertook and their grades (certified by the university or by a sworn declaration).

➤ The outside of **both** envelopes shall **solely** indicate the alias or pseudonym selected by the competitor.

➤ Inquiries about the case or the intramural process shall be e-mailed to **jessup@derecho.uba.ar**. Inquiries about the case may include requests for clarifications and / or requests for assistance with regard to research or formatting. No inquires about the substantive issues of the case will be answered.

➤ **NO OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE** is permitted in the preparation of the substantive portions of the brief or oral argument.
